

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A Brief History of Social Media

- Before the World Wide Web
 - Computer Bulletin Boards
 - Usenet
 - Online Services (AOL, Compuserve, Prodigy)
 - Internet Relay Chat / Chat Rooms
- Before the Smartphone
 - Friendster (2001) / LinkedIn (2002)
 - My_Space (2003) / Facebook (2004)
 - Twitter (2006)
- The Big Three
 - Instagram (2010) / Snapchat (2011)
 - TikTok (2016)

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Teen Social Media Use

- Pew Research (2018)
 - 90% of Teens Use Social Media Daily
 - 45% Online "Almost Constantly"
 - 25% Use Social Media => 4 hours per day
- Common Sense Media (2019)
 - 53% of Children "Own" a Smartphone by Age 11
 - 84% of Teenagers
- C.S. Mott Children's Hospital (2021)
 - 49% of Children 10-12 Use Social Media
 - 32% of Children 7-9
- Waiting on Pandemic Data
 - Consensus / Anecdotal: Use Increased Dramatically



Gorilla Glass: Half-Full or Half-Empty!

• Downsides

- Personal
 - Distraction / Attention Span
 - Depression / Body Dysmorphia
 - Content / Disinformation / Radicalization
- Interpersonal
 - Cyberbullying and Harassment
 - Stalking / Sexual Objectification

Upsides

- Socialization / Ratification
- Research / Education / Efficiency
- Organization / Activism

Social Media Impact on Educators

- Same Psychological and Emotional Issues as Teens
- Blurs the Line Between Professional and Personal
 - Too Much Sharing of Information
 - Potential for Inappropriate Relationships
 - Conflict with Administration or School Community
 - Increased Risk of Criminal Activity
- Increased Exposure to Public Hostility

- Tyler Ray Johnson
- Senior at Tully High School (northern NY)
- Invited to appear in "Senior Spotlight" for school paper
- School principal vetoed one of his interview answers
- Johnson's TikTok video goes viral
- Administrators allegedly lied about school policy

 - Positive Social Networks: BeReal, Gas, etc.
