




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


Defining "Cybertrap"

- Sexual Assault (Facilitated by Technology)
- Solicitation and "Grooming"
- Failure to Report
- Obstruction of Justice

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Model Code of Ethics for Educators

- Released by NASDTEC in June 2015
- Five Principles:
 - Responsibility to the Profession
 - Responsibility for Professional Competence
 - Responsibility to Students
 - Responsibility to the School Community
 - Responsible and Ethical Use of Technology
- Updated Version in the Process of Being Adopted

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The Cyberethical Organization

- Ethics Begins at the Top
- A Profession Questions Itself
- Make MCEE A Standard Element of District Discussions
- Professional Development That References MCEE
- Policies and Procedures That Buttress Ethical Discussions and Decisions

District and Administrative Support

- Cultivate a Culture of Cybersafety
- Implement K-12 Digital Citizenship Curricula
- Hire Good IT Professionals
- Adopt and Regularly Update Policies and Procedures
- Ongoing Professional Development

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Teachers, Protect Yourselves

- Post in Haste, Repent at Leisure
- STOP (scrolling), DROP (your phone), and ROLL (over and go to sleep)
- Self-Regulation and Self-Care
- Slow Down / Ask a Buddy
- Disconnect, Misdirect, and Reflect
- Educate Thyself
- RTFM (software/acceptable use policies)
- Stick to Your Lane
